Dear Sir / Ma'am,

As you may be aware, the Boilers Act, 2025 (No. 12 of 2025) which is a Central Act, and administered by the State Governments through their Inspectorate of Boilers for their respective territories, replaced the Boilers Act, 1923 has introduced significant changes aimed at Ease of Doing Business for the boiler users. The re-enacted Boilers Act, 2025 (No.12 of 2025) has been published in the Gazette of India (Extraordinary) on 4<sup>th</sup> April, 2025 and the provisions of the Act have been brought into force w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> May, 2025 vide Notification S.O. 1943(E) dated 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2025.

2. With regard to provisions relating to Ease of Doing Business (EoDB), the Act, which should benefit boiler users including MSMEs sector, firstly the provisions related to the decriminalisation are significant. Out of the seven offences, to ensure safety of boilers and personnel dealing with boilers, in four major offences which may result in loss of life and property, criminal penalties are retained. For all non-criminal offences, 'fine' has been converted into 'penalty' to be levied through executive mechanism instead of courts as existed earlier.

3. The second set of significant changes that have been incorporated in the Boilers Act, 2025 is with regard to inspections, wherein options have been given to the boiler users, who can get the boilers inspected by:

- i. Boiler Inspectors in the State Boiler Departments, or
- ii. Third Party Inspecting Authorities (TPIAs) recognized by the Central Boilers Board. (At present there are eleven (11) such TPIAs operating in the country and employing about 115 competent persons), or
- iii. Independent Competent Persons recognized by the Central Boilers Board. (At present about 34 Independent Competent Persons are working in the country.)

4. Also, as per section 38 of the re-enacted Boilers Act, 2025, power for exemption from the provisions of the Act in the respective states has also been provided to State Governments and most of the states have self-certification scheme for inspection of boilers.

5. I would like to request that the above-mentioned EoDB provisions should be made brought to the notice of industry, and the Industries Department as well as

the Inspectorate of Boilers should encourage and facilitate the boiler owners to avail of the alternate inspection options. A review by the Chief Secretary on the time bound implementation of the mechanisms required to implement the new provisions of the Boilers Act, 2025 would be appreciated. Technical Adviser, Boilers in DPIIT would be available for any assistance
